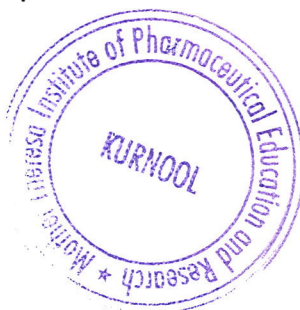
- College Administration

1. Implementation of e-governance in the administration of the college website:

Students can get information and notifications about administration, admissions, and student information in a timely manner via the college website. The website is updated frequently with information on events, conferences, seminars, academic calendars, and committees such as the women empowerment cell, grievance cell, and anti-ragging committee. schedules for exams, test findings, holiday information, etc.

2. Implementation of e-governance in the student admission and support:

Students that are interested in joining the institution fill out the online form on the college website to get in touch with us. Following admissions, the e-governance system will receive student data including course, branch, registration number, admission date, admission category, address, and contact information. The fully automated e-governance system will also upload the academic details of the students. The internal and external marks, together with the attendance, will be uploaded for parents to communicate with so that their children are aware of the data.





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Every year, the college uploads its data to the AISHE portal using the college login page. Data is submitted in a number of ways, including students enrolled by program and category, faculty details by department, programs offered by the college, information about the college's infrastructure, academic performance, results, and financial information. Periodically, the college updates the student and faculty details on the AISHE site and Jnana Bhumi.

3. Implementation of e-governance in finance and accounts

Information about payments and receipts is handled by e-governance. Through this, the knowledgeable auditors will routinely audit the required data.

4. implementation of e-governance in examinations:

Circulars and schedules for theory and practical exams are among the materials available on the college website on exams, both internal and external. The university portal now has both the external and internal practical marks available. The college website contained contact information about the exams. On the college website, past years' exam questions were uploaded for students to refer to. For the benefit of the students, the university's declared examination results were posted on the website and connected to the results portal.

5. Implementation of e-governance in library:

he college website featured a list of book titles and numbers of volumes. The website featured a subject and department-wise classification of books, along with a list of national and international journals' details.

6. Implementation of e-governance in staff details:

The website contained department-specific staff information, including name, title, education, experience, publications, and authorship. With e-governance, staff members can enter student attendance. Moreover, staff can use e-governance to request for a leave as well.
